This fascinating Museum tells the story of the Foundling Hospital, which was established in 1739 by the philanthropist Thomas Coram, to care for babies at risk of abandonment. During its two centuries in operation a remarkable 25,000 children were cared for here.

The Foundling Hospital was the UK's first children's charity and became its first art gallery.

Our guide will take us through more than 275 years of London history, we will learn about the Museum's many treasured objects and discover the stories behind the displays.
